Moving to New Zealand to Teach

New Zealand is an unbeatable place to live and work.

If you are thinking about making the move, there are four key steps in the process to move to New Zealand to teach:

- 1 Get your overseas teaching qualification recognised
- 2 Get registered and certificated
- 3 Apply for a visa
- 4 Actions for when you arrive.

It can take six months to get ready to teach.

Before you start, get familiar with the entire process.

Consider:

- » **Timing:** Start the process as early as possible.
- » **Documentation:** Get all documentation organised to save time.
- » **Funding:** Teachers can apply for an Overseas Relocation Grant of up to NZD \$10,000.

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Get your teaching qualification recognised

Your overseas teaching qualification needs to be evaluated by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA).

You will need to apply for a Teaching International Qualification Assessment (Teaching IQA) to demonstrate your qualification is comparable to a New Zealand Initial Teacher Education qualification.

If you have multiple qualifications, please submit them with your main teaching qualification for evaluation. You can submit a maximum of two additional IQAs when you apply for a Teaching IQA.

Your qualification(s) will be evaluated faster if you provide all the required documents when you submit your application. Please contact your education institution to arrange for them to verify your qualification. Please read and follow all instructions carefully.

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Get registered and certificated

Register to teach in New Zealand

To teach in New Zealand, you need to register as a teacher and apply for a practising certificate with the Teaching Council of Aotearoa New Zealand.

If you have received an employment offer to teach at a New Zealand school, kura or early childhood centre, let NZQA and the Teaching Council know so your application can be fast tracked. It is a priority to get teachers registered and certified when they have a definite job offer.

To apply, you will need the following evidence:

- » proof of identity if currently living overseas (Teaching Council's POI-OS form) that is completed within three months of submitting the application
- » overseas police vetting certificates that are dated within six months of submitting the application
- » teaching qualification and any other relevant qualification/s (if applicable)
- » IQA outcome report from NZQA, if applicable
- » language competency evidence, such as language test results or other applicable language evidence
- » teaching experience evidence such as testimonial/reference letters, recent evaluation/appraisal, recent professional development list, overseas registration details, or CV | resumé
- » name change document if applicable.

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Apply for a visa

Visa options to teach in New Zealand

Once you have a Teaching IQA and are registered to teach in New Zealand, you may apply for a valid work visa.

You must apply for your visa through Immigration New Zealand. Common visas include:

Skilled Residence Pathway

Overseas-trained teachers are eligible to apply for the following two sub-categories only if they have obtained NZ teacher registration from the Teaching Council of Aotearoa New Zealand, along with either a provisional or full practising certificate issued by the Council.

Straight to Residence Visa

Primary, intermediate, and secondary school teachers from overseas are eligible for the Straight to Residence Visa to help address the pressure on teacher supply in primary, intermediate and secondary schools.

Work to Residence Visa

Early childhood teachers from overseas are eligible for the Work to Residence Visa.

Accredited Employer Work Visa (AEWV)

An eligible accredited employer can invite an overseas teacher to apply for an AEWV using Immigration Online. Overseas teachers must show their skills and experience match those the employer told us were required as part of their job check application.

Working Holiday Visa

Working holiday visas are mostly available to young people aged 18 to 30. They allow you to travel and work in New Zealand for up to 12 months for most countries.

Before you start your application for a visa, check:

- » your school is an accredited employer or is looking to become an accredited employer
- » the position you are applying for pays above median wage
- » you have a preliminary salary assessment and a letter offering you a job from the school, to avoid Immigration Officers having to send a request for evidence of your salary level
- » your school is going to offer you either a permanent or a fixed term of at least 12 months.

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Actions for when you arrive

There are actions you will need to take and there are supports available to help you start your teaching career in New Zealand.

Request a salary assessment

When you are appointed to a New Zealand state school teaching position, you and your school must complete a salary assessment with Education Payroll to ensure you get paid at the correct level. You can start this process with Education Payroll as soon as you get a job offer – you don't always need to wait until you arrive.

You must provide an International Qualification Assessment (IQA) for your overseas qualifications and evidence of relevant work from your previous educational employers.

Apply for financial support

As an overseas-trained teacher coming to New Zealand, you may be eligible for an Overseas Relocation Grant. This grant covers certain relocation costs of up to NZD\$10,000.
